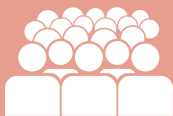

INVESTIGATIONS

The Office of the Prosecutor (OTP) gathers evidence to establish what happened and who was most responsible.

Based on that evidence, the OTP can bring a case before the Court.





INVESTIGATIONS

11 situations under ICC investigation involve conflicts that have left people **displaced** from their homes.

CASES

Who is most responsible for atrocious crimes?

Can the person's guilt be proven beyond a reasonable doubt?

ICC cases are fair, respecting the rights of the accused and the rights of victims, to ensure that justice is done and the truth is established.





CASES

The ICC's first trial opened in

2009.

The first 2 convictions were on cases involving the use of **child soldiers**, who are **under 15**.

27 cases

70%

of cases involve sexual and gender-based crimes.

3 on destruction of historical monuments and religious buildings.

The maximum sentence is **30** years.

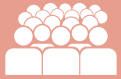
No cases will result in the death penalty.

The ICC offers:

Witness support - logistical and psychological.

Witness protection - face and voice distortion, a pseudonym, a 24/7 emergency response system, and relocation as a last resort.
