I. Introduction

1. Pursuant to Pre-Trial Chamber III's "Order to the Victims Participation and Reparation Section Concerning Victims' Representations" issued on 9 November 2017 ("Chamber" and "Order of 9 November 2017"), the Registry submits the present report on victim representations, together with its assessment of these representations ("Annex").

II. Procedural History

- 2. In its Order of 9 November 2017, the Chamber ordered the Victims Participation and Reparations Section ("VPRS") to: "(i) identify, to the extent possible, the community leaders of the affected groups to act on behalf of those victims who may wish to make representations; (ii) receive and collect victims' representations, be it collective or individual; (iii) conduct a preliminary assessment on whether the conditions set out in rule 85 have been met; and (iv) transmit incoming representations on a rolling basis, possibly every two weeks, together with a brief preliminary assessment".²
- 3. On 7 December 2017, the Registry transmitted to the Chamber the first batch of victim representation forms received and its first report on victims' representations ("First Report on Representations").³
- 4. On 21 December 2017, the Registry transmitted to the Chamber the second batch of representations received.⁴

III. Classification

5. Pursuant to regulation 23bis(1) of the RoC, this document is classified as "confidential", since it contains sensitive information linked to security issues pertaining to the Situation in Afghanistan. Moreover, the annex to the present document is classified as "confidential ex parte, only available to the Registry", because it contains confidential information that may lead to the identification of potential victims.

IV. Applicable Law

6. The Registry submits the present report in accordance with articles 15(3) and 68(1) of the Statute, rules 16(1) and 85 of the Rules, regulation 23bis(1) of the RoC and regulation 102 of the Regulations of the Registry.

V. Submissions

- A. Activities carried out by the Registry to reach out to victims concerned by the Situation in Afghanistan
- 7. During the reporting period, the VPRS has carried out a number of activities with a view to identifying community leaders of the affected groups and reaching out to persons in touch with victims and/or victim communities that may wish to make representations. [Redacted]

B. Victim representation forms received

- 10. Between 2 and 18 December 2017, the VPRS received nine victim representation forms. Of these, two representations, submitted in Dari or Pashto, have been sent for translation and will be transmitted to the Chamber together with the Registry's third report on victim representations.
- 11. The present report is therefore based on seven victim representation forms submitted on behalf of a total of 1,031 victims. Six out of the seven victim representations forms have been submitted online and one was sent by email. Four of the seven representation forms are collective. Six forms were submitted in English and one in Arabic.
- 12. All victims are in favour of the Prosecution's Request and no concerns related to the investigation were expressed. This information is outlined in more detail in the Annex.

C. Rule 85 Preliminary Legal Assessment by the Registry

13. In accordance with the Order of 9 November 2017, the VPRS conducted a preliminary legal assessment of each representation form in order to assess whether the individual or group making the representation falls within the definition of victim under rule 85 of the Rules. The detailed explanation of the assessment criteria applied by the Registry has been submitted together with the First Report on Representations.⁶
