I. Introduction

1. The Registry hereby informs Trial Chamber V ("Chamber") of the appointment of Mr Anthony Abato ("Mr Abato") as Legal Adviser to Witness D30-4914 ("Notification of Appointment"), pursuant to rule 74 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules").

II. Classification

2. Pursuant to regulation 23 *bis*(1) of the Regulations of the Court ("RoC"), the annexes to the present submission are classified as confidential, as they contain personal information and contact details of Mr Abato.

III. Applicable Law

3. The Registry has considered the following provisions: article 68 of the Rome Statute, rules 21 and 74 of the Rules, regulations 67 and 69 of the RoC, regulation 123(1) of the Regulations of the Registry, and articles 5, 8 and 22(3) of the Code of Professional Conduct for counsel ("Code").

IV. Submissions

- 4. On 20 June 2024, Trial Chamber V directed the Registry to appoint a duty counsel for Witness D30-4914, after considering the request of the Ngaïssona Defence Team.¹
- 5. On 26 June 2024, the Registrar appointed Mr Abato as the Legal Adviser to Witness D30-4914.² Mr Abato will be duly provided with access to the relevant material in connection with the case, including the statements and transcripts of

interviews of Witness D30-4914, *via* a secure channel in order to maintain confidentiality at all times.³

- 6. On 24 June 2024, Mr Abato executed the solemn undertakings required by articles 5 and 22(3) of the Code.⁴
