1. On 28 June 2011, the Prosecution submitted the "Prosecutor's First Application Pursuant to Rule 81(2) and 81(4) for Redactions to Potentially Exculpatory Evidence". This application included a request to redact document KEN-OTP-0039-1467. When the Prosecution received this evidence from the Government of Kenya, the last four pages (1529-1532) were largely illegible.

2. On 14 July 2011, the Single Judge ordered the Prosecution to re-submit a readable copy of these four pages.<sup>2</sup> The Prosecution regrets that it cannot produce a more readable copy of these four documents, as it does not possess them.
