**NOTING** the Decision issued by the Presidency on 15 March 2012, assigning the situation in Libya to Pre-Trial Chamber I (the "Chamber");<sup>1</sup>

**NOTING** Pre-Trial Chamber I's Decision of 24 January 2012 (the "Decision of 24 January") ordering the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (the "VPRS") to report to the Chamber every three months on the applications for participation in proceedings received in the situation in Libya;<sup>2</sup>

**NOTING** that in its Decision of 24 January, the Chamber ordered the VPRS to abide by the Victim Participation Framework set up by the Chamber, in another composition, relating to the situation in the Democratic Republic of Congo;<sup>3</sup>

**NOTING** articles 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 16(1) and 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 23-bis, 24-bis (2) and 86 of the Regulations of the Court;

**CONSIDERING** that at the current stage no judicial proceedings in which the Chamber has determined that victims may participate have been initiated relating to the situation in Libya;

**CONSIDERING** that since the periodic reports previously filed by the Registry in the situation in the Democratic Republic of Congo have been filed as confidential and *ex parte* annexes only available to the Registry, the Registry continues to follow this practice;


