#### I. Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") herewith submits this Communication Report <sup>1</sup> regarding Incriminating, Rule 77 and potentially exculpatory evidence disclosed to the Defence teams of Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo, Aimé Kilolo Musamba, Jean-Jacques Mangenda Kabongo, Fidèle Babala Wandu and Narcisse Arido on 11 April 2014.<sup>2</sup>

2. The disclosure was made pursuant to, and in accordance with, the Single Judge's 4 April Decision, ordering the Prosecutor to "to disclose to the Defence, no later than Friday 11 April 2014, the documents contained in Annexes B, C and D to her Application with the redactions granted."<sup>3</sup>

## II. Request for Confidentiality

3. The Prosecution requests that Annexes A, B and C, appended to this Report, be received as "Confidential" as they relate to evidence disclosed *inter partes* that should not be released to the public.

### III. Submissions

- 4. The Confidential Annexes to this Report list the evidentiary items disclosed.
- 5. Confidential Annex A includes documents related to Narcisse Arido, namely (i) items obtained from his email account received on 23 January 2014, (ii) items related

to his first statement to the French authorities, and (iii) items seized from him and handed over to the Prosecution by the Registry on 29 January 2014.
