**NOTING** Trial Chamber V's Decision on victims' representation and participation notified on 3 October 2012, directing the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (the "VPRS") to file every two months, in cooperation with the Common Legal Representative, once appointed, a comprehensive report on the general situation of victims as a whole, including statistics about the victims' population and information in relation to registered and non-registered victims (the "3 October Decision");<sup>1</sup>

**NOTING** Trial Chamber V(A)'s Decision notified on 14 November 2013, directing the Registry to include additional specific information in its two month reports (the "Decision of 14 November");<sup>2</sup>

**NOTING** articles 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 23 *bis* and 86 of the Regulations of the Court;

**CONSIDERING** that annex B of the present filing, which addresses the issues listed in the Decision of 14 November,<sup>3</sup> is submitted with the status "Confidential *ex parte*, only available to the Registry and the Common Legal Representative" because it contains sensitive information that relates to the safety and physical well-being of victims;
