I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Prosecution hereby notifies Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") of the disclosure of evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute, and rules 76(3) and 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

II. CLASSIFICATION

This filing is classified as public with one confidential annex, comprising the list
of evidence disclosed to the Defence. This annex is classified as confidential since
it contains confidential information.

III. SUBMISSIONS

- 3. Between 14 and 20 April 2022, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence 4 packages of evidence, consisting of 75 items (434 pages):
 - Pre-Trial INCRIM package 117, consisting of 4 items (58 pages), including material related to 2 witnesses;¹
 - Pre-Trial INCRIM package 118, consisting of 15 items (28 pages), including material related to 2 witnesses;²
 - Pre-Trial Rule 77 package 79, consisting of 34 items (140 pages), including material related to 8 witnesses;³ and
 - Pre-Trial Rule 77 package 80, consisting of 22 items (208 pages), including material related to 14 witnesses.⁴
