Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor, acting in conformity with rule 121(2)(c) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, hereby communicates the incriminatory evidence disclosed pursuant to articles 61(3)(b) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute.

Observations

- 2. Today, Friday, 30 November 2018, the Office of the Prosecutor disclosed to the Defence *Pre-Confirmation INCRIM package No.* 22 containing 569 pieces of incriminatory evidence.
- 3. Essentially, these are the statements of the two witnesses and, as in *Pre-Confirmation INCRIM package No. 21*, photographs taken at various locations of interest in Timbuktu¹ and used to create 360-degree panoramic images that will be communicated as soon as possible.
- 4. There are redactions in the metadata of 19 of the documents in this package.² In redacting the metadata, the Ofice of the Prosecutor acted in accordance with the Single Judge's decisions of 16 May 2018³ and 16 November 2018.⁴
- 5. As a result, with respect to the metadata:
 - Code A.4 was used for the documents numbered 1-18 and 569; and
 - Code F was used for the documents numbered 1-12, 14-18 and 569.
- 6. The redaction codes and pseudonyms applied appear directly in the relevant metadata.
- 7. The following redaction codes were used for the content of the documents:
 - Code A.1 was used for the documents numbered 1, 14 and 16;
 - Codes A.2.2 and A.2.4 were used for the document numbered 1;



- Code A.2.6 was used for the document numbered 18;
- Code A.3.2 was used for the documents numbered 14, 16 and 17;
- Code A.3.4 was used for the document numbered 14;
- Code A.4 was used for the documents numbered 1, 13, 14, 16-18 and 569;
- Code A.6.1 was used for the documents numbered 1 and 14;
- Codes A.8, D and E were used for the document numbered 18 (Code A.8
 was used for dates that could reveal the movement of witnesses and
 thereby indirectly cause them to be identified);
- Code B.2 was used for the document numbered 14;
- Code B.3 was used for the document numbered 14; and
- Code F was used for the documents numbered 1, 2, 13, 14, 16-18 and 569.
- 8. The codes applied to the content of documents are listed in the table in Annex A (in the right-hand column entitled: *ICC-01/12-01/18 Redactions applied to the content of the document*). The *Pseudonym* field in *E-court* contains the pseudonyms used.
- 9. These redactions do not hinder the Defence's ability to properly acquaint itself with the relevant documents and properly examine the photographs in question.
- 10. The Office of the Prosecutor files Annex A as confidential since it relates to an *inter partes* process between the Office of the Prosecutor and the Defence.
