



KAMBAYI BWATSHIA: Professor Kambayi was born in Charlesville, Kasai, on 1 June 1942. He holds several academic qualifications and distinctions: qualified upper secondary teacher from the *École Normale Supérieur IPN*; Master of Arts (MA) in History from the University of Montreal, Canada; *Philosophiae Doctor* (PhD) in History from the University of Montreal, Canada, with thesis entitled: "*La Presse belge Francophone face à la crise congolaise 1958 à 1963*"; English Language Certificate, University of Brunswick, McGill University, Concordia University; *Certifié d'Etudes de Coopération Internationale* [Certificate of Cooperation Studies] at the Center for International Studies and Cooperation (CECI), Montreal, Canada. Positions held: Teacher at Collège Saint-Pierre and Institut Marie Goretti, Mbuji-Mayi, 1966-1968; Teaching Assistant and Lecturer at the History Department of the *Institut Pédagogique National*, IPN-Binza, 1971-1975; Professor of Contemporary Black African History at Laval and Montreal Universities, Canada, 1978-1980; Trainer of Canadian Volunteers for Africa at CECI, 1978-1980; Associate Professor, Professor, Ordinary Professor at the *Université Pédagogique Nationale*, where he was the Academic Registrar.
