On behalf of the Registry I bring your kind attention to the message below and would be very grateful if you could kindly convey it to the Judges of TCV:

The Registry has taken note of the Chamber's order for submissions by the Detention Section of the Registry, for observations on the Ngaissona Defence Observations to the Ninth Registry Report (ICC-01/14-01/18-460-Conf-Exp), and in particular, on the measures taken in the Detention Centre as regards COVID-19.
