- 12 Please be seated.
- 13 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:32:49] Good morning, everyone, and welcome to
- 14 today's session.
- 15 Madam Court Officer, can you kindly mention the case.
- 16 THE COURT OFFICER: [9:33:02] Good morning, Madam President, your Honours.
- 17 The situation in the Central African Republic II, in the case of The Prosecutor versus
- 18 Mahamat Said Abdel Kani, reference of the case ICC-01/14-01/21.
- 19 And we are in open session.
- 20 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:33:17] Thank you very much.
- 21 Can counsel announce their representation, please.
- 22 MS MAKWAIA: [9:33:23] Good morning, Madam President, your Honours. At the
- 23 Prosecution bar table today, myself, Holo Makwaia, senior trial lawyer; Leonie von
- 24 Braun, trial lawyer; Yuichiro Omori, Vanessa Hernández, and Ramu Bittaye. Thank

25 you.

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- 1 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:33:48] Thank you very much, Ms Makwaia.
- 2 Yes, counsel for the victims, please.
- 3 MS PELLET: [9:33:56](Interpretation) Thank you, Madam President.
- 4 The victims are represented by Tars Van Litsenborgh and myself, Sarah Pellet,
- 5 *Counsel within the Office of Public Counsel for Victims.
- 6 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:34:12] Thank you very much, Ms Pellet.
- 7 Ms Naouri, for the Defence, please.
- 8 MS NAOURI: [9:34:19](Interpretation) Thank you, Madam President. Next to me,
- 9 Jacobs, Léa Allix, and behind me, Jacquemin, Maître Valduriez and Manon Lanselle.
- 10 And I am Jennifer Naouri.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:34:33] Thank you very much, Ms Naouri.
- 12 And, for the record, I note that the accused, Mr Said, is in court.
- 13 Good morning, Mr Said.
- 14 MR SAID: [9:34:49](Interpretation) Good morning, Madam President. Good
- 15 morning, your Honours.
- 16 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:35:02] Thank you.
- 17 Good morning, Mr Witness.
- 18 WITNESS: CAR-OTP-P-0547 (On former oath)
- 19 (The witness speaks Sango)
- 20 THE WITNESS: [9:35:18](Interpretation) Good morning, Madam President.
- 21 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:35:22] I hope you rested well this weekend.
- 22 THE WITNESS: [9:35:33](Interpretation) Yes, indeed. I rested extremely well.
- 23 Thank you.
- 24 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:35:41] Thank you very much.
- 25 So today we are going to continue a little bit with your direct examination, after

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- 1 which counsel for victims, if she still wants to do that, will ask you a few questions.
- 2 Then Mr Said's counsel will ask you some more questions. So I just want to remind
- 3 you that you are still on oath.
- 4 I will ask the Prosecutor to continue her direct examination, please, of the witness.
- 5 MS MAKWAIA: [9:36:27] Thank you, Madam President. I request a private session
- 6 to start with.
- 7 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:36:38] Madam Court Officer, can you kindly get us
- 8 into private session.
- 9 (Private session at 9.36 a.m.)
- 10 THE COURT OFFICER: [9:36:51] We are in private session, your Honours.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:36:54] Thank you.
- 12 Madam Prosecutor, carry on, please.
- 13 MS MAKWAIA: [9:37:06] Thank you, Madam President.
- 14 QUESTIONED BY MS MAKWAIA: (Continuing)
- 15 Q. [9:37:12] Good morning, Mr Witness.
- 16 A. [9:37:16] Good morning.
- 17 Q. [9:37:20] You have given evidence before the Court last week that you were held
- at the OCRB in a basement in the main building at the OCRB. Do you recall that?
- 19 A. [9:37:51] Yes, I do remember.
- 20 MS MAKWAIA: [9:37:56] With your leave, your Honours, I would like displayed at
- 21 tab 62, CAR-OTP-2118-3740. This is the FSS report where I would like the
- 22 photograph 2118-3761 to be displayed.
- 23 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:38:56] Did you say tab 62?
- 24 MS MAKWAIA: [9:38:59] Yes, Madam President.
- 25 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:39:30] Carry on, please.

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- 1 MS MAKWAIA: [9:39:38] I can't get my evidence --
- 2 THE COURT OFFICER: [9:39:45] It's on evidence channel 1.
- 3 MS MAKWAIA: [9:39:48] It's not playing.
- 4 Q. [9:40:11] Mr Witness, can you tell the Court what is depicted on -- starting with
- 5 the first photograph before you.
- 6 A. [9:40:41] That is the administrative bureau of the OCRB.
- 7 THE INTERPRETER: [9:40:47] Says the witness.
- 8 MS MAKWAIA: [9:40:52]
- 9 Q. [9:40:53] Can you tell the Court what is the second photograph.
- 10 A. [9:41:15] It is the same administrative office of the OCRB.
- 11 It's not working.
- 12 THE INTERPRETER: [9:41:28] Says the witness in French.
- 13 MS MAKWAIA: [9:41:32]
- 14 Q. [9:41:33] What's not working?
- 15 A. [9:41:44] The stylist I have in my hand is not working.
- 16 Q. [9:42:16] Okay, Witness, shall we -- shall we start with the first photograph, and
- can you mark it "A", because you've used the same numerals for both pictures.
- 18 Can you just mark that one "A", and then explain to the Court what is depicted at
- 19 number 1.
- 20 A. [9:43:47] Can I -- can I speak? May I go ahead?
- 21 Q. [9:43:52] Yes, please, Mr Witness. Start with photograph marked "A".
- 22 A. [9:44:08] The photo where I have put "A" is the administrative office of the
- 23 OCRB. This is just next to Moov. This is behind the house. And the other arrow
- 24 which I have put on the photo is in front of the opening of the building.
- 25 Where I've put "A" is the window, (Redacted)

- 2 (Redacted)

- 4 (Redacted)
- 5 THE WITNESS: [9:45:29](Interpretation) Are we in private session? I just want to
- 6 know that for sure before I continue.
- 7 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:45:37] Yes, we are, Mr Witness. We are in private
- 8 session. Please carry on.
- 9 THE WITNESS: [9:45:52](Interpretation) Fine.
- 10 You see, that is the wall, the fencing which separates the compound from OCRB
- 11 with -- from the major road. This window there. It is through this window that
- 12 Yaya and Tahir were at this level. When they saw me, they saw me at this window
- 13 level. They came to interrupt my testimony which the police investigator was taking.
- 14 It was a young person. *That cell is next to the Moov building. The dark shadow is
- 15 the tree which was cut. The small building there, that's where they dragged me to
- 16 take me behind in order to torture me. This is what I can explain to you relating to
- 17 this photo.
- 18 MS MAKWAIA: [9:47:27]
- 19 Q. [9:47:28] Okay, Witness, can you tell the Court what is that you've marked as
- 20 number 2.
- 21 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:47:42] And number 2 of the top photo.
- 22 MS MAKWAIA: [9:47:46] Thank you, Madam President.
- 23 Q. [9:47:49] That's the top photograph, Witness.
- 24 A. [9:48:04] Sorry. I thought I'd explained that. That -- that is the cellar where
- 25 we were held. You see, at the foundation, in order to go down, there is a hole. The

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- 1 hole is at this level here. The hole is at this level. This is going down to the
- 2 basement. It is the hole, which I already talked about, which they barricaded.
- 3 Number 1 is the bureau which is above the cellar -- the cell.
- 4 Q. [9:49:13] Can you mark the place you say the hole would be found underneath
- 5 as "B" on this photograph.
- 6 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:49:39] Do you want him to mark -- because I see a
- 7 number "2". So you want him to mark a "B" beside the "2", as he has done?
- 8 MS MAKWAIA: [9:49:44] That's correct, Madam President.
- 9 Q. [9:49:47] Mr Witness, can you now move to the second photograph and explain
- 10 to the Court, starting with number 1, then 2, 3, until 6, why you've marked those
- 11 areas.
- 12 A. [9:50:40] Thank you. I just told you that this arrow points to the space behind
- 13 the building. When you pass through -- on those stairs, you go to -- and you can
- move on to see the window, it is the window of the office of Mr Said.
- 15 *Number 2 is the window where I kneeled down to see the baggage that they were
- 16 unloading from the tipper truck brought by Mr Said. I was positioned at this
- 17 window to see the booty.
- 18 I repeat, I was on my knees at this window, and I could see my younger brother. So,
- in all, you can see the hole where I looked to see my brother; I looked through this.
- 20 And on that day, there was (Redacted) who came, and I positioned myself here to see
- 21 my sister.
- Number 4, you see, look, look. Yeah, you can see the two sides of the building.
- 23 They were positioned there in order to see me via the window. It is when the
- 24 investigator has --

- 21 And what is that you've marked as number 6?
- 22 On the second photograph, your Honours.
- 23 A. [9:56:41] Thank you. I told you, if you want to ask me questions, ask them one
- 24 after the other. If you ask me the first question and I haven't answered yet, and then
- 25 you ask me a second question, it upsets me. I've put down those different numbers

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- so that you can ask me questions according to the numbers as I've put them on the
- 2 photo.
- 3 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:57:21] It's all right, Mr Witness. Don't get upset.
- 4 Okay?
- 5 THE WITNESS: [9:57:32] (No interpretation)
- 6 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [9:57:32] Let's go according to your own -- how you
- 7 want to tell us your story. You've given us number 3. So tell us about number 4,
- 8 window number 4.
- 9 THE WITNESS: [9:57:59](Interpretation) Sorry. I didn't get cross. Thank you.
- 10 Let me repeat.
- 11 I sometimes suffer from a loss of memory. Even today. If I start thinking, then I
- lose my thread. If I made that statement, it's not only because of the Prosecution.
- 13 The Defence also has to prepare itself in order to ask me questions in accordance to
- 14 what I've just said. I don't want the Defence counsel thinking that I favoured the
- 15 Prosecution's questions, and that when it comes to their turn, that I make life
- 16 complicated. No.
- 17 So number 4 corresponds to the office where I was taken for questioning by an
- 18 inspector. Yaya and Tahir were on the other side. And when they saw me, they
- 19 came to take me into the jail.
- 20 During that time, Said was in this place and said, "The things are simple. If they
- 21 want to make things complicated, we will make it complicated for them."
- 22 I repeat, Yaya and Tahir saw me here. Said got up here and explained what
- 23 happened. And he said, "The things are simple. If they want to make things
- 24 complicated, we will make it complicated for them." It was on that day.
- Number 5, I repeat, is the side where you could see into the hole. There was a tap in

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- 1 this particular position. Next to the tap, when you got out of the jail, we were
- 2 positioned here. We, the detainees, we were gathered in that place there. And our
- 3 families came on this side of the compound.
- 4 Now, the pipe -- there was actually a pipe there. And the stairs led to the office of
- 5 Mr Said. The window where I stood to see when he would come with his bin, I
- 6 would actually stand at that window. The bin was actually blue. Thank you.
- 7 Now, number 7 corresponds to jail 3. It was the first jail where I was put in.
- 8 Number 8 actually separated us from the literacy department. Now, this wall
- 9 separated the OCRB from the literary department. And these are a few details that I
- 10 can share with you.
- 11 Now, the small dots is the compound of the OCRB.
- 12 If you have any further questions, please feel free to ask them.
- 13 MS MAKWAIA: [10:02:20]
- 14 Q. [10:02:21] Thank you, Witness.
- 15 You have referred to Tahir. Can you tell the Court who was this person.
- 16 A. [10:02:43] *I think that from the start, I've been telling you Tahir was Yaya's
- teammate. They always worked together. And he had a goiter.
- 18 Q. [10:03:04] Which group did he belong? Can you tell the Court, please, which
- 19 group did Tahir belong to.
- 20 A. [10:03:29] Tahir was Seleka. I met him at the OCRB. I don't know if he was
- 21 part of Said's team or not, but what I can tell you, that they were together, and they
- 22 always worked in a team of two.
- 23 Q. [10:03:56] And what kind of work did they do?
- 24 A. [10:04:14] Is this really a question, the one you just asked me? What did the
- 25 Seleka do? They were involved in the killing business. What else do you think

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- 1 they could do?
- 2 Q. [10:04:32] Thank you, Witness.
- 3 Madam President, I move to tender this as a Prosecution exhibit as marked and
- 4 described by the witness.
- 5 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:04:46] Madam Court Officer, is it possible for us to
- 6 have an ERN mark on that one, please.
- 7 THE COURT OFFICER: [10:04:53] Madam President, yes. It will be
- 8 CAR-REG-0002-0012. It's not yet updated in Nuix, but we will do it in due course
- 9 and inform the parties, the participants and the Chamber accordingly by email too.
- 10 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:05:12] Thank you very much.
- 11 Madam Prosecutor, be mindful that on Friday you asked for 15 minutes to finish off
- 12 with this witness.
- 13 MS MAKWAIA: [10:05:51] I did, your Honours. I probably was slightly optimistic.
- 14 Upon review, we realised we still had an aspect to cover, and of the projected hours
- 15 we had given for this witness, about an hour remained for us. So, with your
- 16 indulgence, Madam President, your Honours, I humbly request to be allowed to use
- 17 this time and to finish and provide the Court the full scope of this witness's evidence,
- 18 of what he lived through. Thank you.
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:06:37] Carry on, please.
- 20 MS MAKWAIA: [10:06:39] I'm obliged, Madam President.
- 21 Q. [10:06:42] Mr Witness, you've also testified to the Court of various parts inside
- 22 this building, apart from the hole. Do you recall that?
- 23 A. [10:07:11] Yes, indeed, I do remember.
- 24 MS MAKWAIA: [10:07:19] Your Honours, can we have displayed at tab 57,

25 CAR-OTP-2033-7044, please.

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- 1 Q. [10:08:04] Mr Witness, what do we see in this photograph?
- 2 A. [10:08:25] This is inside our cell. This was in fact above the cell. This office
- 3 was above the cell. I did not see the table when I was there, and I don't know if it
- 4 was Mr Said's table that was put up there. And behind the wall, you had Mr Said's
- 5 office. It's the -- it's Said's office that's just behind the wall. And this is the window
- 6 from where I observed him when he came with the bin with the spoils after pillaging.
- 7 I have a question to ask you. You asked me -- I don't know whether it was last
- 8 Friday. It was at the end of the session. I don't know if you've already asked me
- 9 about this hole. I remember that you asked me about this hole. I hadn't replied as
- 10 yet, and the session was over.
- 11 The hole, in fact, was at my side. And on the other side was this table. Do you see?
- 12 It was here. The table, you can see.
- 13 Q. [10:10:19] Thank you, Witness. Would you like to mark the window where
- 14 you saw Said with his booty as number 1.
- 15 MS MAKWAIA: [10:10:49] Madam President, I move to tender this as a Prosecution
- 16 exhibit.
- 17 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:10:55] Yes.
- 18 Madam Court Officer, please, an ERN mark.
- 19 THE COURT OFFICER: [10:11:00] Yes, Madam President, CAR-REG-0002-0013.
- 20 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:11:07] Thank you very much.
- 21 Madam Prosecutor, you may carry on, please.
- 22 MS MAKWAIA: [10:11:14] Thank you, Madam President.
- 23 I would now like to exhibit tab 70, CAR-OTP-2033-7305, please.
- 24 That's the wrong one. It's 7305 at the end.
- 25 Apologies, Madam Court Clerk. We've already used this one. I'll use another one.

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- 1 Q. [10:13:21] Mr Witness, you were about to tell the Court about being taken to
- 2 Camp de Roux last week. Do you recall that?
- 3 MS NAOURI: [10:13:49](Interpretation) Your Honour, we think for the -- for it to be
- 4 fair to the witness, it's -- you must give the reference of the theme that the Prosecution
- 5 is trying to ask and also refer to the transcript just to jot his memory and to lay the
- 6 foundation.
- 7 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:14:23] Madam Prosecutor, do you have the
- 8 transcript of that day that he made -- that the witness made that statement?
- 9 MS MAKWAIA: [10:14:38] I do. Let me just get it. It was towards the end of the
- 10 session on Thursday.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:14:46] Yes, it must have been. Can you just get
- 12 the -- maybe the reference point.
- 13 Ms Naouri, if the witness did not say so on that day, couldn't he have told the Court
- 14 that he never say he was taken to Camp de Roux.
- 15 MS MAKWAIA: [10:15:19] I can actually summarise the evidence, if that would
- 16 assistance, as we locate the actual lines.
- 17 Q. [10:15:26] Witness, you have --
- 18 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:15:27] Just a moment, Madam Prosecutor.
- 19 Yes, Ms Naouri.
- 20 MS NAOURI: [10:15:37](Interpretation) Sorry, your Honour. I'm listening to the
- 21 French interpretation. So it was continuing. Just to answer your question, it is not
- 22 clear what the witness said. So it's actually useful to see in the transcript what the
- 23 witness said instead of interpreting or paraphrasing so that we can actually lay the
- 24 foundation on the basis of what the witness actually said in the court.
- 25 MS MAKWAIA: [10:16:17] Okay, Madam Prosecutor, as I locate the actual lines and

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- 1 passage he testified to, I will move to a different aspect.
- 2 MS NAOURI: [10:16:31](Interpretation) Your Honour, just to help the Court.
- We've actually found the -- just to help out the Court, we found the reference. It's
- 4 transcript 13, page 50, lines *25 to 26 in the French transcript.
- 5 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:16:54] That's the point I'm making, because I do
- 6 recall that the witness did make that kind of a statement. My question is, with the
- 7 question posed by the Prosecutor to the witness, if really the witness was not taken to
- 8 Camp de Roux, he will say so. What was wrong with the Prosecutor's question,
- 9 apart from the fact that she did not make a reference point?
- 10 Thanks for the reference anyway. The Prosecutor can carry on so that we don't
- 11 waste more time.
- 12 MS MAKWAIA: [10:17:35]
- 13 Q. [10:17:35] Mr Witness, you had started telling the Court you were taken to
- 14 Camp de Roux with Yaya and Tahir, and you went through three checkpoints. Do
- 15 you recall that?
- 16 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:17:53] Can you make reference to the information
- 17 that Ms Naouri gave you, Madam Prosecutor.
- 18 MS MAKWAIA: [10:18:03] I'll have to go to the French.
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:18:07] What Ms Naouri just gave you.
- 20 MS MAKWAIA: [10:18:13] She is in the French channel. I'm in the English. But I
- 21 have the English now, Madam President. That would be page 55 of the transcript,
- starting at line 18 to page 56, line 2. I can read.
- 23 MS NAOURI: [10:18:41](Interpretation) Your Honour --
- 24 MS MAKWAIA: [10:18:42] I can read that.
- 25 MS NAOURI: [10:18:47] (No interpretation)

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- 1 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:18:49] Yes, Ms Naouri.
- 2 MS NAOURI: [10:18:51](Interpretation) *Your Honour, thank you.
- 3 In the French transcript, there is no mention of Yaya and Tahir; which is precisely
- 4 why we wanted the reference, to avoid a leading question, such as the one that was
- 5 just asked. The question was leading because it mentioned Yaya and Tahir, who are
- 6 not mentioned in the transcript. So the witness did not say it.
- 7 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:19:13] That's fair enough.
- 8 Let's hear what the Prosecutor says. She is going to read the transcript.
- 9 Madam Prosecutor, please.
- 10 MS MAKWAIA: [10:19:22] Thank you, Madam President.
- 11 Q. [10:19:27] So I'm going to start at page 55, line 18: "They took me, they put me
- in a vehicle, and we went to Camp de Roux. I thought we were going to the Palais
- de Renaissance. No, no, they took me to the other. They took me to Camp de Roux,
- and he arrived at the gate. They recognised everyone; Yaya knew everybody.
- 15 Everybody knew Yaya and everybody else. I was in the vehicle with the
- 16 Seleka -- was with me. I was between two Seleka elements. Yaya was in front in
- 17 the cab. When we got into the vehicle, we went through three checkpoints, and we
- arrived to the courtyard of Camp de Roux."
- 19 And then I asked the witness to stop, Madam President.
- 20 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:20:35] Yes. There is no mention there of Tahir
- 21 though.
- 22 MS MAKWAIA: [10:20:41] My mistake, Madam President. I stand corrected. I
- 23 will now proceed with your leave.
- 24 PRESIDING JUDGE SAMBA: [10:20:50] Carry on, please.

25 MS MAKWAIA: [10:20:56]

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- 1 Q. [10:20:56] Witness, can you tell the Court who else was with you as you were
- 2 being taken to Camp de Roux on this day.
- 3 A. [10:21:28] Thank you. I told you, the day I was taken, General Issa was sitting
- 4 on the bench in front of Said's office. He was talking to him. I was upstairs. Said
- 5 wasn't there. Tahir entered. Yaya entered. *And then they said, "Let's go." At that
- 6 moment (Redacted). They said that the authorities wanted to see me. And
- 7 when we were leaving (Redacted)
- 8 THE INTERPRETER: [10:22:21] Says the witness in French.
- 9 THE WITNESS: [10:22:23](Interpretation) We were in the vehicle. Yaya was in the
- 10 front and Tahir was with me. And there were others in the pick-up. I don't
- 11 remember the names of the other people. I have been to school. I can retain certain
- 12 things. Today I'm explaining what exactly happened, and I'm here to tell you the
- truth, the entire truth, and to narrate factually what I experienced and what I saw.
- 14 He is also the head of a family. He's a father. And if he hadn't behaved badly, he
- 15 wouldn't be here. I'm not here to push him down. I'm here to tell you what I saw,
- 16 what I experienced, and what I had heard. I'm here to tell you the truth. I
- 17 did -- hadn't seen God with my own eyes, but I know that God exists. So if I
- 18 remember someone's name, I will tell you. And if I don't remember, I can't. And
- 19 I'm here to tell you the truth.
- 20 If you ask me today if Said killed someone in front of my eyes, I would say, "No, I
- 21 have never seen Said kill someone." But I'm actually telling you the facts that I
- 22 experienced on a personal level. I'm not lying. Thank you so much.
- 23 I also would like to add that Francis -- I would like to add that I'm frank, and that's
- 24 part of my personality. That's what I would like to say, and I'm here to answer any

of your questions.

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- 1 MS MAKWAIA: [10:24:35]
